The U.S. Government permits legal travel to Cuba under 12 different categories that range from professional meetings and sporting competitions to religious and humanitarian travel. One of the broadest and most common categories of travel is "People-to-People," which requires travelers maintain a fulltime schedule of activities that involve meaningful interaction with individuals in Cuba. There are many ways in which travelers can easily fulfill this requirement while having an incredible experience in Cuba and being thoughtful, respectful and kind with the many Cubans you interact with during your travels.

Check-in at Boutique Hotels.

6 pm Visit to the Lizt Alfonso Academy, a women-led dance company and school for local youth, specializing in various types of dance. Private performance by the adolescent dance group and exchange with the dancers and teachers.

7:30 pm **Welcome Dinner at La Guarida paladar**, famous not only for its delectable dining, but also as the location for the film *Strawberry and Chocolate*. It is housed on the third floor of a large, old town house carrying the charming ambience of the early 1900s.

9:30 pm **Performance** by the internationally renowned Cuban music collective, **Interactivo**. <u>Visiting New Orleans musicians (to be announced soon) will sit in on part of their set.</u>

Friday, Jan 13

9 am Break into small groups to enjoy a morning of visits exploring Cuban culture and Cuba's African roots.

- Visit the home of La Reyna y Real, a female hip hop/jazz duo. The group's music focuses on breaking down stereotypes in Cuban society, including machismo, healthy relationships, gender relations and race.
- **Visit the Habana Compás Dance** studio for a performance and discussion with instructors and students. The dance company has quickly developed into an institution in Cuba, running a free school for youth in the afternoons.
- **Demonstration in AfroCuban drumming with** Brenda Navarrete, star percussionist and vocalist.

12 pm **Enjoy lunch in Old Havana.** Break into small groups to check out some of the Old City's coolest lunch spots and find time to wander the beautiful plazas and backstreets of Old Havana.

2:30 pm

Visit the Amadeo Roldan Music Conservatory with the Horns to Havana music project. Performance by Cuban students and jam session with Trombone Shorty Foundation students.

***Amadeo Roldan is a prestigious music high school that has been led by great Cuban musicians and educators including Roldán, Guillermo Tomás and Diego Bonilla. The Conservatory has educated and shaped some of the most significant international Cuban composers and performers like Bebo Valdés, Leo Brower and Harold Lopez-Nussa.

*** Horns to Havana is a US-based organization dedicated to instrument donation, repair and training and education and cultural exchanges, is a longtime support of the conservatory and its students

The Gia Maione Prima Foundation and The Horns Project/Horns to Havana will give away instruments to underserved students who attend Conservatorio Amadeo Roldán, a leading music school in Cuba that is based in Havana.

7 pm

Dinner and music at Galeria Taller Gorría. Dinner under the stars and **live music by female hip-hop duo Reyna y Real**, who will be joined by visiting New Orleans musicians (*to be announced soon*) for part of their set. Galeria Taller Gorría is an art gallery and socio-cultural project created by entrepreneur and artist Adam Perugorría that has become a confluence space for the best of the national and international artistic avant-garde.

9:30 pm

Late Night Groove. Join Cubans to dance the night away with a performance by singer and percussionist Brenda Navarrete.

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Saturday, Jan 14

9:30 am

21st **Century Cuba – Part One**. Collin Laverty, expert on Cuba and U.S.-Cuba relations, will moderate a panel discussion with leading Cuban thought leaders about the Cuban economy, politics and bilateral relations with the U.S. <u>At the Hotel Nacional</u>.

11 am

21ST **Century Cuba – Part Two**. Presentation and roundtable discussion with Cuban expert(s). Choose one.

- Race & Gender in Cuba, a discussion with Cuban hip hop pioneers, Obsesion.
- *Independent Media*. Discussion with Cuban media expert(s) about the opening to internet, new independent media sources, censorship and tension and competition between state and independent media.

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- Socio-economic discussion with urban planner, whose presentation will touch on housing, infrastructure, investment and restoration programs. It's bound to leave you with a better understanding of why Havana looks the way it does today and possibilities moving forward.
- 1 pm Enjoy a traditional Cuban meal overlooking the Straits of Florida at the Hotel Nacional. Tasty Cuban food served family style with a great view of the Havana sea wall and the old Spanish fortress. The setting brings many back to the 1950s, when the mafia held its annual meetings at this historic hotel.
- 3 pm **Musical Exchange: Exploring the roots.** Explore the deep, historical musical roots between New Orleans and Cuba, much of which leads back to Africa. Our hosts from Cuba and the visiting New Orleans musicians will explore these through instruments, chants and songs in a unique Havana setting.

Dinner on your own. Work with your CET Travel Curator to make dinner reservations at one of Havana's great paladars. Transportation to dinner and from dinner to the evening concert will be coordinated for you.

8 pm Intimate dinner and performance by Carlos Varela at Paladar El Cocinero. Varela, considered the Bob Dylan of Cuba, will share songs, music and stories for a special group of invited guests. Checkout the HBO special Poet of Havana about Varela's music and impact on Cuban society.

Sunday, Jan 15

- 10 am **Private performance by the Youth Symphony Orchestra.** This 14-member group will leave you breathless.
- Walking tour of Old Havana's Historic Center, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1982. Wander through the Plaza de Armas, a scenic tree-lined plaza formerly at the center of influence in Cuba. It is surrounded by many of the most historic structures in Havana as well as important monuments. See the Plaza de San Francisco, a cobbled plaza surrounded by buildings dating from the 18th century, dominated by the baroque Iglesia and Convento de San Francisco dating from 1719. Visit the Plaza Vieja, surrounded by sumptuous houses of the Havana aristocracy from the 18th and 19th centuries. Visit Plaza de la Catedral de San Cristóbal de La Habana.

Lunch on your own. Work with your CET Travel Curator to make dinner reservations at one of Havana's great paladars.

4 pm Choose a cultural activity

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- Boxing with champions. Visit a world-renowned gym for a training session with former Olympic boxers.
- **Behind-the-Scenes Art Tour.** Visit the homes and studios of independent Cuban Artists.
- 7 pm Cigar tasting with a local expert at Café Madrigal. He will explain the qualities and traits of fine Cuban cigars and how to properly light and smoke what is considered the finest tobacco in the world. Café Madrigal, owned and run by film director Rafael Rosales, is housed in a beautiful colonial mansion with the walls lined with captivating artwork.
- 7 pm **Farewell dinner and New Orleans-Havana concert.** Enjoy a delicious Cuban meal under the stars, followed by a blowout concert featuring top New Orleans musicians (*to be announced soon*) and Cuba's leading contemporary funk artists.
