

The Getting Funky in Havana cultural exchange project seeks to further strengthen the New Orleans – Havana connection through music and the arts. Led by the next generation of musicians and community leaders in both cities, the weeklong event will include workshops at schools and NGOs, impromptu jam sessions, performances at the Fabrica de Arte Cubano (FAC), a street parade in Old Havana and a grand finale concert featuring the Trombone Shorty Foundation, The Soul Rebels and Tank and the Bangas, all-star bands from New Orleans, and Cimafunk, Cuba's top musical act.

BUILDING BRIDGES AND CELEBRATING DIVERSITY

Changes by the U.S. Government have made it more difficult for Americans to travel to Cuba and Cubans to travel to the U.S., taking a toll on people in both countries. Rhetoric and hostility between governments have heightened and the overall bilateral relationship has reached a low point not seen in a decade or longer. *Getting Funky in Havana*, through music and cross-cultural engagement, serves to maintain and build bridges, recognizing that it's the people in both countries that benefit from a more open relationship. The event also serves to celebrate the diversity of Cuban and U.S. culture and the strong African influence in music and the arts; and pass the torch to a new generation of artists that are ambassadors of their cities and cultures.

THE POWER OF GETTING FUNKY
